## Park Fencing

### Under 6's Area Fencing

A discussion took place regarding the amount of damage to the under 6's area fencing and the new recommended guidelines for play area fencing.

Re-occurring damage is leaving the wooden palings in a hazardous condition and a potential Health & Safety issue.

After discussion and debate a proposal was put forwarded to remove the wooden fencing and replace with play area metal fencing, meeting (ROSPA approved) recommended requirements. The wooden fencing will be used for the Allotments on Bridge Road.

### TangoRail

**TangoRail is a revolutionary steel railing system in that its component parts are not welded together but are connected by a unique and patented method. This means that unlike fully welded systems, the panels can be easily adjusted on site to follow the contours. This eliminates the need for specially fabricated panels and detailed site surveys that will add extra cost and time to the project. TangoRail components are powder coated before assembly thereby allowing a full range of multi colour options, even with a single fence panel. This is not normally possible with welded systems.**

**TangoRail is RoSPA (The Royal Society for the Prevention of Accidents) approved.**
